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1 Overview

1.1 Purpose

To outline the procedure on how to clean and disinfect the exterior of the electric breast pumps located in NICU.

Mothers of babies and infants in NICU

1.4 Definitions

Symphony BreastThe Symphony Breast Pump is an electric breast pump with a two-phase
expressing pumping mechanism.

2 Clinical Management

2.1 Roles and Responsibilities

All Staff

It is the responsibility of the Change Nurse Manager, Associate Charge Nurse Manager (ACNM)/Coordinator, together with Healthcare Assistant (HCA) and Nurses to monitor and maintain the cleaning and disinfection schedule as outlined in the procedure.

2.2 Equipment

- Appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE), e.g. gloves, aprons and face shield (if splash is likely).
- Disinfectant wipes

2.3 Procedure

2.3.1 Frequency

- The exterior of the electric breast pumps in Expressing Room are cleaned daily by the NICU HCA.
- If the pump is visibly soiled or contaminated with blood or body fluid, the breast pump should be cleaned and disinfected immediately.
- Expressing pump in nursery is cleaned by Nurses after each mother's use before they are used by another mother, according to Waikato DHB Infection Control

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Procedures: Cleaning and disinfection processes and Reprocessing of health care equipment.

- Expressing pump in Parents Room is cleaned by HCA after mother and baby are discharged.
- Mothers are encouraged to report any visible soiling or contamination and malfunction to the Nurse/ACNM/Coordinator.

2.3.2 Membranes on pumps

 Membranes are changed three times per week by NICU HCA on Monday, Wednesday and Friday to prevent cross-infection and maintain functioning of the pumps.

2.3.3 Cleaning and Disinfection

- Wash hands and don PPE, e.g. gloves, aprons and face shield if splash is likely, according to standard precautions.
- Detach all removable parts used for expressing, clean before the disinfection.
- Clean all exterior surfaces with disinfectant wipes using vigorous rubbing.
- Use vigorous rubbing ensures thorough cleaning because the use of friction physically removes micro-organisms and debris from the surfaces of the pumps.
- Dry the pump with paper towel thoroughly prior to re-use.
- Remove PPE and perform hand hygiene.

3 Audit

3.1 Indicators

- The exterior of all pumps awaiting use is cleaned daily
- In addition, expressing pumps are cleaned after use
- The membranes are changed three times per week
