1 Overview

1.1 Purpose

To ensure a rapid and appropriate response in a life threatening clinical situation for a neonate at Waikato Hospital.

1.2 Patient / client group

Neonates in the period immediately after birth or the days following birth, but prior to discharge home.

This may apply for a neonate, up to a week of age, in the community coming into the Emergency Department or Delivery Suite.

1.3 Definitions and acronyms

NICU	Neonatal Intensive Care Unit					
SMO	Senior Medical Officer – in this context referring to those in the neonatal speciality					
Neonatal Team	Inclusive of Nurse Practitioners, Clinical nurse specialist, registrar and Fellow					
Neonatal emergency	A life threatening event which requires urgent clinical intervention					

2 Clinical management

2.1 Roles and responsibilities

All Staff:

To action the described emergency response pathway in the instance of a neonatal emergency.

Neonatal Medical Team:

To respond to all neonatal emergency calls as per the described emergency response pathway

2.2 Guideline

Neonatal Resuscitation / Emergency Response Call

- 1. Neonatal emergency identified
 - Call 99777
 - State <u>Neonatal emergency</u> and <u>Location</u> (e.g. theatre 4 level 2).....
- 2.If neonatal team is already there and they ask for the SMO then:
 - Call 99777
 - Ask for the <u>on call neonatal SMO</u>, and state <u>Location</u> (e.g. theatre 4 level 2).....

3. If asked

- Dial 23703 (NICU ACNM)
- Ask for a <u>senior nurse</u> to attend the resus and give them your <u>Location</u>

What's the expected response time from NICU in an emergency?

- 3 mins to delivery suite
- > 6-7 mins to main OT

Have you been asked to call a neonatal SMO after hours???

Response time if they are not on site could be up to 20 mins.

2.3 Neonatal Team Contact Options

- At all times a member of the neonatal team will be carrying the neonatal emergency pager in addition to another member of the team carrying the neonatal phone.
- At all times there is an SMO on duty to support the neonatal team as required. After hours the SMO is on-call off site.
- In the rare event of multiple neonatal emergencies at one time contact the neonatal second response phone to request direction.

Second response neonatal phone	027 354 7312	When asked by an attending neonatal team member at a life- threatening event.	
		In the instance of multiple emergencies requiring response	
SMO phone	Via operator dialing 99777 stating "On-call Neonatal SMO"	When asked by an attending neonatal team member at a life- threatening event.	
Neonatal ACNM	Extension 23703 Or 021 240 8955	When asked by an attending neonatal team member at a life-threatening event.
